

Minn. Stat. §518B.01 Subd. 14 outlines penalties for violations of protection orders issued in Minnesota or in another state or jurisdiction. Persons who violate protective orders must be sentenced to a minimum of three days imprisonment and must be ordered to participate in counseling or other appropriate programs selected by the court. If the court stays imposition or execution of the jail sentence and the defendant refuses or fails to comply with the court's treatment order, the court must impose and execute the stayed jail sentence. A violation of an order for protection shall also constitute contempt of court and be subject to additional penalties provided elsewhere in Minnesota law.

Minnesota is a mandatory Public Law 280 state, except the Red Lake Reservation.
